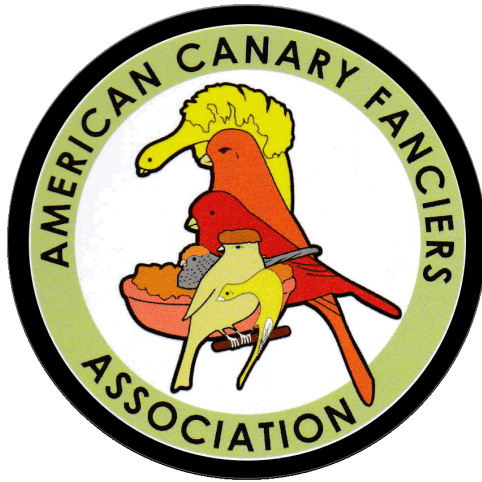

Who remembers Newcastle Disease? This was a very hard time on all our breeder members. I had a friend that lost her chickens, because one contracted Newcastle Disease. Her whole flock had to be destroyed. I also, knew a couple of other friends where their neighbors informed the State of their birds and the State came up and destroyed all their canaries.

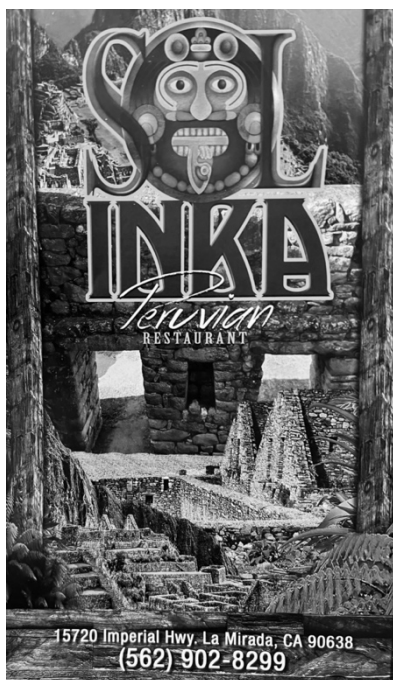
After the Show is the...

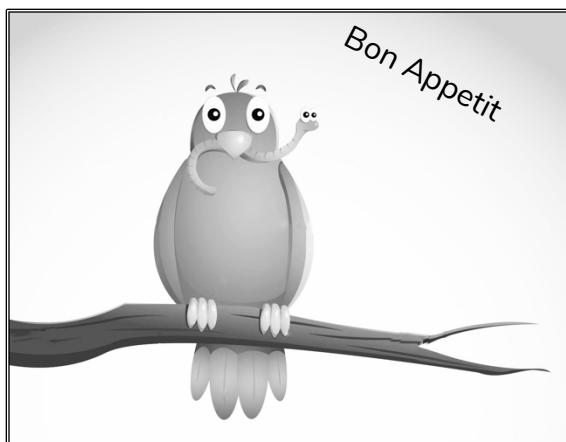

American Canary Association Show Rules

This is a Members Only Show but visitors are very welcome to attend & learn about the canary fancy. Non-members may become members at the show to enable them to exhibit birds the same day at the show.

There is a cost of \$5.00 for each bird entered into competition. ***Separate entry forms are required for each Division of birds entered into the show.*** Fasten show tags to the LOWER LEFT CORNER of the show cage. A mini drinkers should be placed on the right-side front of all the show cages. A few mini drinkers will be available for use on a loan basis.

ACFA advocates the use of regulation show cages whenever possible, but non-regulation cages are permitted when appropriate cages are not available. Cages must have water in a mini-drinker or & roller canary seed mix on the cage floor. Cage trays may be fixed in place with black tape only. We recommend that insecure doors on cages be secured discreetly with black tape as well. No cage should be marked in any way that brings attention to it. Roller seed & water will be available for your use. If needed, black tape will be available at the registration desk, with the head steward and the head secretary. No cards, signs, or display advertising will be allowed on or about the show cages before judging.

Prior to the show, any Board member or steward may assist with classifying birds. Once the birds have been submitted for competition, the judge for the Division must do any additional reclassifications. Stewards are charged with the task of searching out misplaced birds. During the show, handling of the birds and cages is permitted by the stewards or judges only. During the show, exhibitors and guests are asked to remain outside the staging area for the birds. Seating is available for exhibitors and visitors to view the judging. After judging is complete, everyone may enjoy viewing all the birds, ***but not before judging is completed.***

ACFA reserves the right to make such changes as deemed best to add to, combine, or cancel existing classes if only one or two birds are entered in a class or section. Classes of one bird must be to standard to receive awards.

The registration form must state the band number of each bird entered. Forms will not be accepted by the registrar unless the band number for each bird is entered on the registration form.

All birds will be judged by the National Standards for the variety by an authorized judge using either natural, or florescent light simulating natural light. All birds in the Young Class must have closed bands showing the year hatched. Birds with open bands or not banded will be shown in the Old Class of the appropriate section. **In order to win, birds must be banded with closed bands and the exhibitor must have banded the bird.** Type birds are judged by comparison to the standard method: colorbred birds are judged by the point system.

Full Discretionary power is given to the judges to withhold any or all prizes for want of merit.

Judges are free to enter birds in competition but, neither judge nor household members, nor partners of the judge, may exhibit birds in that judge's section.

No bird entered into competition may be removed from the showroom before the published checkout time on Saturday, unless they have received an approval signature from the President. Awards will be presented Saturday after the show and before the show hall is disassembled. All exhibitors are expected to help with disassembling the show hall after the show.

Management will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits on the way to, from or during the show, but will assume diligent care while in possession of the birds exhibited. The stewards will see that the birds are properly staged and watered during the show.

Club members are welcome to bring sale birds for sale on show day. All persons selling birds must be ACFA club members. Tables for bird sales are available at a cost of \$50 per table. Tables may be shared by more than one member. Members selling birds are asked to issue a sales receipt to avoid confusion at checkout. Individuals buying birds must have a sales receipt when exiting. For ease of selling birds, the owner's name, variety of canary and sale price of the birds should be placed on each sale cage.

Exhibitors should pay special attention to these 4 items:

- **Disqualifying Conditions for Birds:** Injured or sick, Wheezing and/or Labored Breathing, Nasal Discharge & Fluffed Feathers. For the safety of all birds, sick birds should be left at home. Judge or Show Manager's decision concerning ill or injured birds is final.
- For purposes of this show: A novice is someone who has been showing birds for less than 3 years and has never had a Division win. After 3 years, an exhibitor will no longer be considered a Novice. Novice birds will compete with the entire population of canaries and then novice birds will compete among each other for the novice awards. Novices show tags must be marked "N" in the appropriate space in order to be considered for the novice awards.
- For everyone's comfort, exhibitors should be aware that there should be no private conversations with the judge prior to judging.
- To avoid problems at check out with purchased birds, be sure to ask seller for a receipt

Important Show Info in Brief!

- Exhibitors may enter birds that they have raised and banded. Exhibitors may not enter birds that they have purchased. Division winners will be checked for ownership. If a winning bird is a purchased bird rather than one raised and banded by the exhibitor, the award will go to the second-place bird.
- Anyone wanting advance show tags and registration forms, request them by emailing or phoning Fidel Mendez – fidelito0821@gmail.com or (714)-341-9445
- Exhibitors can drop off birds at the hall on Friday November 7th from 8:00 to 10:00PM or Saturday November 8th from 7:00AM to 9:00AM. It makes for a much easier Show morning if birds are in on Friday night. This service is available for those living in the LA area as well as those traveling to the show.
- The Tony Bucci award is a perpetual trophy awarded to the exhibitor with the most Division wins. No one will know who wins until the awards are given!
- No birds may leave the hall before the Awards are given at the end of the show without the express permission of the club president.
- All exhibitors are expected to help with tearing down the show benches and returning the hall to its clean original condition after the awards are given. Jose Soto will direct the tear down.
- Assistance is needed in disassembling the show benches, carrying parts to the trailer for loading, breaking down and moving tables, sweeping and organizing. Exhibitors are expected to help to the limits of their physical abilities.

MEET THE JUDGES



Barbara Rosario-Booras – California- Type Judge

I entered a three-year apprenticeship judging program on Type and Colorbred canaries in 1980. Since completing my apprenticeship program, I have judged from Hawaii to Puerto Rico, throughout the U.S., Canada and the National Cage Bird Show on numerous occasions. During my

forty plus years, I have bred and shown many varieties of canaries, both of Type and Color. I have been an active member at the local level and National level since 1980. I served the Board of Directors of the NBS for over thirty years. My philosophy is really simple. You should never consider yourself an expert because your birds will teach you something new every year, Be willing to share your knowledge with others in the fancy, All though the Fancy does have its competitive side, win or lose it should be fun and enjoyable. After all it is only a hobby.



Jose Carrascosa - Spain Old Variety Judge

I was born in Almuñecar, Spain, but I moved to Denia (Alicante) 47 years ago. My passion for birds started since I was 17 years old. I started breeding and became more involved in the canary world almost immediately. I applied and approved to become a judge in 1994 (NATIONAL SPANISH JUDGE), then I became an OMJ in 2003. I've

been judging for more than 30 years. I been in countries like Iraq, Kuwait, Jordanian, Mexico, Portugal, Italy, and numerous shows in Spain. Local and nationals, I lost count on how many times I been a judge, but I have a lot of local, national, international, and world champions.

My name is Bernardo Pascual Baldovi. I was born and raised in Burriana, Spain. I'm 62 years old. I been breeding Type Canaries since I was 13 years old, my specialty is in Frills Canaries. I tried to become a judge in 1983, but since I was too young, I didn't really care. I

kept breeding and showing birds all over the place. In 2017 after a long wait I decided to apply for judge again and I was approved as a National Spanish Judge and then as an OMJ Judge. I been judging in local and national shows in Spain and couple times in the World Championship.

Tárraga Flores, I am first of all a breeder of canaries since my childhood. A long journey of more than 58 years breeding canaries mainly in the range of colored canaries and also some Fringílidos and hybrids of the same ones, where I have obtained important prizes in international and world-wide contests, where I have been learning every day of the lived experiences and of all the fans to the CANARICULTURE and ORNITOLOGY. In 1982, after having prepared myself technically, I took the exam for national color judge in Spain, where I passed the tests. In Spain where I passed the tests and created recognized as a judge of national color canaries. In the year 1985, already with more experience, I presented myself to become a judge of Fringílidos and of hybrids. Later in the year 1990, I took the tests for international judge of the OMJ-COM.
